"We keep hearing about the breakdown of family values and family life today in America and elsewhere in the Western world. Well, marriages do break down, before they break up. I suppose. think they have a right to be happy, and if they are not happy, they look for somebody to blame. Married people, whether they have children or not, tend to blame their spouses, and the children get caught in the middle. For richer, for poorer, for better or for worst, it doesn't seem to matter.
