WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Second Sunday of Easter

After the death of Jesus, Thomas fled from the company of the other Apostles and thus missed the first appearance of the risen Lord. When he finally rejoined them, the first thing Jesus did was to show him his own wounds. Jesus felt no need to hide his wounds for they were the proof of his love.

Jesus invited Thomas to touch those wounds. In truth, Thomas

was the wounded one. He was wounded by grief, loneliness, doubt, and despair. In his pain he wanted to be alone. Even though his wounds were invisible, they were very real. Jesus was able to see them.

It was Jesus who touched Thomas' wounds, cured him of his unbelief, and made him whole and well again. The world is full of *Doubting Thomases*,

who will not come to believe unless they can touch Jesus wounds



and see the radiance of his face. This can happen only if he is seen to be alive in us, his followers!
