WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Third Sunday of Easter

The apostles were gathered in the upper room with the doors locked. The room of the Last Supper was marked by the absence of the Crucified One. The memories must have been powerful and bittersweet.

Here Jesus had washed their feet. Here he turned ordinary bread and wine into his body and blood. It was here too that they had sworn that they'd

never abandon him, a loyalty that didn't last till the cock crowed three times. The apostles were full of fear, doubt, guilt, worry, grief and despair.

The wounds of love

There was a man who was very attached to his father, who had been a laborer all his life. When the father died, the son was grief-stricken. As he stood quietly gazing at his father in the coffin, he was particularly struck by his father's hands. They seemed to reveal the essence of his life.

"I will never forget those magnificently weathered old hands. They told the story of a countryman's life in the eloquent language of wrinkles — old scars and new. My father's hands always bore some fresh scratch or cut as adornment, the result of his latest tangle with a scrap of wire, a rusty pipe, a stubborn root. In death they did not disappoint, even in that small but valuable way.

"It is not given to sons to know everything about their fathers, but I have those hands in my memory to supply evidence of the obligations he met, the sweat he gave, the honest deeds he performed. By looking at those hands you could read the better part of his heart."

Jesus said to the apostles: 'Look at my hands and feet...Touch me and see for yourselves...See my wounded hands and side. Cease doubting and believe.'

Recently, in *The Chicago Tribune*, Chicago Auxiliary Bishop Thomas Paprocki spoke about the anti-Catholic mentality in our society, especially in newspapers, and particularly the Tribune. The Trib has been like that since 1853, he said. It's like that now when it prints an article by Mr. Bill Daley, who attacked Cardinal George because of the Cardinal's attitude toward Notre Dame's invitation to President Obama to speak and receive an honorary doctor of laws degree at this year's commencement — as though it is the Cardinal's personal opinion and not the position of the Church, our creed in defense of life!

That's how it was not long ago when the Pope was attacked because of his speech in Africa in which he said that the use of condoms does not solve the worsening problem of AIDS. Dr. Edward Green, director of the Harvard AIDS Prevention Project, although not a Catholic, recently defended the Pope and said he is right about this issue because the data prove that in Africa the Pope's approach works while the condoms approach worsens the epidemic. Few newspapers ran the story. However, when something bad happens in the Church, or anything related to the Church, its schools, or whatever is Catholic, then it is front page news. Why? It seems deliberate, doesn't it? I wonder. The agenda is obvious!

What does the ordinary Catholic Christian person say when his or his Church, spirituality, faith, priests, principles, beliefs are attacked? What does he or she say? What do you say?
