This week we Christians will be celebrating the great mystery of Christ's love

for us. "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." This is week we remember how Christ lived out the truth of these words. He took upon himself the sins of all the world. It is this passion, this suffering, that leads to salvation.

The Passion shows how Jesus responded to what was done to him. He absorbed all the violence, transformed it, redeemed it, returning it as love and forgiveness. This is the victory of love over the Evil One and all his power of destruction. There was nothing but love in Jesus. Even when they nailed his hands and feet to the cross, he went on loving.

Jesus didn't die to save us from suffering. He teaches us how to suffer. Those who unite their suffering to Christ's are a source of blessing for others and will share in Christ's Easter glory.

## He bore our sins

It was early November and the leaves lay scattered on the ground. Each household was expected to gather its own leaves and bag them for re-

moval. (The leaves are a symbol of sin.)

- A few people didn't bother at all. They walked over them as if they never existed. (*These are people for whom there is no such thing as sin.*)
- One man swept the leaves off his lawn and onto the street. They became a mess and a hazard for drivers, but he couldn't care less and figured it was now the city's job to clean up the mess. (*These people blame others for their sins.*)
- Most people took care of their own leaves, but wouldn't dream of raking a neighbor's leaves. (*These people accept responsibility for their own sins.*)
- Finally, there was one remarkable man. He not only collected the leaves on his own lawn, but from others' lawns, and he even cleaned the street without complaining. (*This man is Christ, who willingly died for the sins of all.*)

#### Dear Friends!

On Palm Sunday, we give particular consideration to one dimension of human



life: injustice. I wonder how many millions of people today are a lot like Christ because they suffer injustice and cannot prove their innocence because there is no one to whom they can prove it?

How many people today suffer under repression by the system in power? How much injustice is contained in people's decisions, and in the testimony of lying witnesses?

How many people nowadays suffer injustice because they have no money, no one to defend them, or no one to sympathize with them? How much of Christ's sufferings are reflected in the bad fortune of our times?

How often do we judge others without knowledge of their circumstances, their character, or their experiences? Why is it that people can be so selfish that they want to put their own idea of justice above all others?

The reasons are probably clear. When a person does not respect God's authority, whenever he lacks "fear of the Lord," or whenever he is not answerable to God for his life, then a million different definitions of justice come into existence. That opens the door to distorted notions, and then "justice" becomes "injustice."

As we begin Holy Week, let us ask ourselves one main question: Are we people of justice? From where do we get our beliefs, and do we know what's right and what's wrong? Does Christ suffer today because of us?
