THOUGHT OF THE WEEK

"Blessed be that moment, O Mary, when the angels took you up into heaven!"

The Year 2009 is the 800th year in the life of the Franciscan Friar family.



Jesus, our Christ and Lord, was a life-giving presence for Francis of Assisi. Perhaps the crucifix in San

Damian's chapel helped form the image of Christ so etched in the heart and mind of Francis; perhaps the image of Christ that was already within Francis drew him to the crucifix in that chapel. Probably something of both were operative within Francis. This crucifix most associated with Francis and Franciscans today depicts Christ crucified, but one who has already gloriously over-



come suffering and death. The five wounds do not seem to be signs of suffering, but are rather like fountains gushing forth blood, which in the scriptures is a sign of life. Among the other representations on the cross are the five major witnesses: Mary the mother of Jesus, St. John the apostle, St. Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and a centurion who would make an act of faith when Jesus died. The followers of Jesus are not depicted as sorrowful, not even his mother Mary; rather there is a hint of smile on their faces as if their faith already saw through the death into the resurrection. The entire crucifixion scene depicts the mystery into which Frances plunged so deeply. In the challenges of this world, one comes to experience the victory of the cross. As our Blessed Mother knew, and the centurion would exclaim, "Clearly this man was the Son of God." (Mark 15:39).
