WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

As we go through life, things happen to us that cause us either to make this Faith our own and try to live it with more conviction, or we may gradually drift away from it. Some transforming experiences may be quiet and non-dramatic; others are brought about by painful experiences such as addiction,

trauma, or the loss of a loved one. We need to make the Faith our own. We often find the meaning of Faith through personal experience, but we have to be clear about what the word 'Faith' involves.

When Jesus saw that many of his disciples were leaving him, he said to the apostles, "Will you also leave me?" These words are addressed to us too. It's not the Lord who leaves us, but we who leave him. We need to make Peter's profession of Faith our own—the fruit of a personal decision. The Lord himself is the one who strengthens our Faith, but we also need to confirm it to one another.

WISDOM'S CORNER Will you also leave me?

A so-called 'cradle Catholic' woke one day and got a shock. It suddenly dawned on him that everything relating to his faith had been given to him from birth. It all seemed second-hand, like clothes handed down to him from an older brother.

He had been baptized as a baby, and naturally had no memory of it. All through his youth religion had been taught to him by his parents, the Church, and school authorities. Although he had never resisted this or resented it, now that he was a young adult it suddenly hit him that he had accepted it all without conviction. He had never made the faith his own.

It was a disturbing moment for him. Of course he soon realized that the faith was not the only thing he had inherited. Most of what he was, his very identity, was inherited, but the faith was the thing that worried him most. He had never "owned" his faith. He began to wonder what it really meant to him, and what his life might be like without it. He realized that his faith would no longer be "second-hand" if he personally drew closer to God — with the *help* of God's Church. The choice was always his.



The "Canticle of Brother Sun," also known as the "Canticle of Creation," is a thirteenth century classic composed by Francis

of Assisi in 1225, a year and a half before he died. He looked out over the Umbrian Valley and saw the work of God. He was legally blind when he put his view of creation into words and had it sung by Brother Pacificus. The beauty of creation was so etched into his heart that physical blindness did not deter his vision from the heart. The canticle was both new and old. It was new insofar as Francis put into words the glories of



God's creation as his brothers and sisters—brother sun, sister moon, brother wind, sister water. He believed that all creation formed a family since all came from the one hand of God. It was old insofar as he was recognizing the world as good, a concept already realized as such in the Book of Genesis and in so many psalms, and prophets. Above all, God in the person of Jesus Christ came to consecrate all creation and was the crown of creation. Christ did not only come to save the world from sin, but even before sin occurred God began creation as the pedestal for his glorious appearance in Christ Jesus. For Francis, creation was not a stumbling block in pursuing God; creation was the throne of Christ. The glory of God was to be found both in the throne made by God and most fully in the one on the throne who eternally came forth from God. "Bless the Lord, all you works of the Lord, praise and exalt him above all forever." (Daniel 3:57)
