THOUGHT OF THE WEEK

"What is done with the heart is real."

The Year 2009 is the 800th year in the life of the Franciscan Friar family.



Francis bore the cross of Christ within himself, and he likewise lived on the cross of Christ. Certainly the San Damiano cross depicting the living Christ was most dear to him. However, another form of the cross found a way into his life, and it still continues as a symbol among many Franciscans. It is the tau cross. The tau is a letter in the Hebrew and

Greek alphabets; it corresponds to the English letter capital T. It is a cross with the horizontal beam resting on top of the vertical beam rather than the two crossing each other. It has its origins in the *Book of Ezekiel 9:1-7* where those marked with the

tau are to be saved from the wrath of God. The cross would find favor with Francis, who was so dedicated to God's saving power revealed through the cross of Christ. The Ezekiel text would foreshadow this marvelous mystery of our salvation. This text of the Old Testament prophet was used as the theme of the opening homily of the Fourth Lateran Council (1215) at which Francis seems to have been present. From that time on the tau is used by Francis as part of his signature. This way of signing his name seems to express the desire of Francis that all be signed with the saving presence and power of Christ. "May I never boast of anything but the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Galatians 6:14).
