WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Third Sunday of Advent

There is a dear note of rejoicing in today's Mass. The basis for this rejoicing is the nearness of the Lord. As we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, the Lord is very near us. He is in our midst.

The theme of the nearness of the Lord is also at the heart of today's Gospel. John the Baptist tells the people what they must do in order to prepare for the Lord's coming and to escape his searching judgment. At the same time he makes it clear that he is subordinate to Jesus. The presence of God is the cause of our joy, because joy is of the spirit. In

the end, only God can fulfill our dreams, and profound joy is the best sign of his pres-

ence. But there can be no deep joy for us as long as the things we do are different from the things we believe.

So, prepare and rejoice: the Lord is very near!
