WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Second Sunday of Advent



Salvation is one of the great themes of Advent. Today a great cry goes forth from the liturgy: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make

straight his paths. ...and all flesh shall

see the salvation of God."

These are wonderful words. They are a declaration of God's love for us. If there is some crooked attitude, or some crooked way of behaving that needs to be straightened out in our lives, let us try to do so with God's help. But we must not think that the Lord won't come to us unless we are completely perfect.

Indeed, God knows that we are all in need of a savior.

God comes to us sinners in need of redemption. He comes to us his wounded children in need of healing. What we need is the humility and trust to acknowledge our sins and wounds before him. When we approach God in need, we invite God in. May we gladly reach out!

WISDOM'S CORNER Paths to straighten

One Sunday, as a preacher approached his pulpit, the words of the Gospel—Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths—were ringing in his ears, and a thought suddenly struck him: It's not the Lord's paths that need to be straightened out but ours! It was then that he decided to address these words to his people:

We let misunderstandings run on from year to year, meaning to clear them up some day. We keep quarrels alive because we don't make up our minds to sacrifice our pride and end them.

We pass people sullenly, not speaking to them out of some silly spite, yet knowing that it would fill us with shame and remorse if we heard that one of them were dead tomorrow.

We let a friend's heart ache for a word of comfort or appreciation, which we mean to give him some day.

If only we could realize that "the time is short", how it would break the spell. How we would go instantly and do the thing that we might never have another chance to do.

So, if there is some crooked attitude, or crooked way of behaving, or crooked relationship that needs to be straightened out, let us do it now. Then we will truly be preparing the way of the Lord to come to us.

Advent is an excellent time to aim ourselves in the right direction, and to commit ourselves to the right path.
