A friend of mine recently showed me some research about antiaging. Among the find-



ings I saw several interesting items. Experts tell us how many years longer we can live if we do the following:

- —Eat breakfast every day (1.1 years)

- —Get at least 7 hours of sleep nightly (3 years)
