lots of confessions, there are no absolutions—at least not in the name of Christ.

What people need is a sense of radical forgiveness that simultaneously recognizes the sinfulness of what they did and affirms them as people worth caring about, as people worth dying for. Human beings can't grant that kind of forgiveness; only God can.

Forgiveness was at the heart of Jesus' ministry, and he passed this power on to his apostles. The power to forgive sins in his name is one of the greatest gifts Jesus left to his Church, and is exercised mainly through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We need this tangible expression of God's forgiveness!

# WISDOM'S CORNER

#### A NEW VIOLIN

One day Doris went into her church office in order to practice a violin solo she was to play at Mass that evening, only to find her violin in pieces — scattered across the floor. Doris was crushed. She thought: Who? Why? How can I forgive that person?

A week later the police found the vandal and Doris went to his home. When she saw the skinny, 11-year-old sitting next to his father, she understood that the real tragedy was not her shattered violin, but a young life that seemed headed for a shattered future. Instead of berating the child and demanding restitution, she found herself saying, "I forgive you, and God will, too, if you ask him."

A few days later, the boy came to see the pastor, asking hesitantly, "Is there any work that I can do at the church to pay for the violin?" At the sign of his repentant heart, the pastor shared the Gospel with him, and the boy received the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Doris purchased a new violin, but later remarked, "It would never compare with this 'new creature' in Christ Jesus. I learned anew that God's grace is sufficient to give me a forgiving heart."
