WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Feast of the Lord's Baptism

Today's Gospel show us one of the critical moments in Jesus' life — his baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan River. This was a turning point in his life. Prior to this, Jesus lived the comparatively quiet and secure life of a village carpenter in Nazareth, but after his baptism, his life was never the same. He began his public life.

What Jesus did that day at the Jordan River foreshadowed the rest of his public ministry. He would not

keep himself apart from sinners. He would not wait for them to come to him. He would seek them out and befriend them. He would save them.

Most of us have known moments that have proved to be turning points in our lives. From time to time we need to examine the direction our lives have taken. It is worth contemplating that at our own baptism, we were pointed in a very



specific direction. In baptism we became disciples of Jesus. We are called to use Good to overcome Evil, and we are called to love one another.

The ultimate question for a disciple of Christ is: Am I being true to the direction in which I was pointed at my baptism?

Those who are parents surely remember the baptisms of their children, recalling the exact day, time, people. I ask you this: Do you remember what you promised at those baptisms? These two people spoke about their children with such joy. They now live their lives in serenity because they see that their children are healthy, happy, and in possession of a deep spirituality. How beautiful!
