WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Conversion of St. Paul

St. Paul was a man who could be described as larger than life. He is sometimes referred to as a "fool for Christ". Before his con-

version he was a ruthless persecutor of Christians—afterward, a passionate evangelist for the Lord.

He proclaimed Christ to the Jews, evangelized pagans, preached and converted gentiles, and wrote letters that have become foundational sources of Christianity. He was the object of hatred, imprisoned, scourged many times, and even stoned.

His burning faith disturbed people and his many contradictions disrupted things. Merciless persecutor of Christians, he nevertheless recognized the Son of God when, on the road to Damascus, Jesus spoke to him directly.

He alone seemed to understand that the future of Christianity lay in the Gentile mission. Master letter-writer with a genius for conversion, he has been called the "architect of Christianity. He imposed his vision of Christ, and well before the Gospels were written, he forged the principles that would guide the Church.
