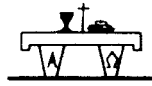

*The Year 2009 is the 800th year in the life of the Franciscan Friar family.*



With today's bulletin we begin as series of short articles on St. Francis of Assisi. Each is based on a particular event in the life of Francis.

Francis was born in either 1181 or 1182 in Assisi, Italy to Peter and Pica Bernardone. He died as the sun was setting on October 3, 1226. According to an ancient way of calculating time, the new day was seen already beginning with the setting of the sun, hence the Feast of St. Francis is celebrated on Oct. 4, the day of his birth into heavenly glory. Francis established the First Order of Friars Minor in 1209. Pope Innocent III approved the scripture-based rule composed by Francis for his new community. Later the Franciscan family would expand by the founding of the Poor Clares (the Second Order), and then the Third Order that comprises the Secular Franciscans, various brotherhoods and many sisterhoods. In the year 1205 Francis was praying in the presence of a crucifix in the chapel of San Damiano just outside the town of Assisi, Italy. He heard the voice of Christ saying, “Francis, go repair my house which, as you see, is falling completely into ruin.” Certainly the chapel was neglected. Francis immediately became a one-man maintenance committee and began repairing this “house of the Lord”. Then Francis came to recognize that he himself needed reform, and he began repairing the “house of the Lord,” which was his own self. As others began to follow in his path, he saw the need for a new community within the Church, and he began repairing the “house of the Lord,” which was the local Church. As even more people throughout his known world began to sense the presence and spirit of his community, he began repairing the “house of the Lord,” which was the universal Church. His vision of what God asked of him was first focused on what was so easily visible and tangible but then expanded, and his strength increased. So, in our lives, does God’s vision and strength within us expand and increase.

Into ever-widening thought and action

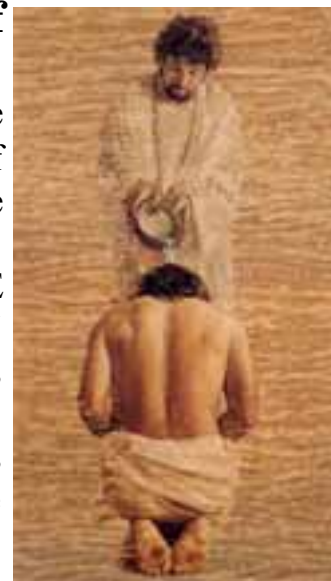
Into that heaven of freedom, my Father, let my country awake.
