Francis of Assisi had a

special attraction to the feast of Christ's holy birth. This feast captured for him what was most dear and precious in his faith, namely, that God came among us so that we could be as close to God as possible. What we could not accomplish, God accomplishes for us. Francis pondered this great mystery of God's incamation among us and sought for words and actions to proclaim this great truth. Late in his life a grace came upon him and through him into the entire world. A new Bethlehem appeared in the little Italian town of Greccio on Christmas Eve in the year of Our Lord, 1223. The holy night was aglow with torches carried by the faithful who sang out God's praises. Some hay was prepared together with a cow and a donkey nearby. A certain virtuous man said that a little child was lying lifeless in a manger and as Francis approached, the child awoke from a deep sleep. Thus the first known Nativity scene was erected in a marvelous manner. Indeed the hearts of many had forgotten how close God is to us, but that night the mystery was uncovered anew. Throughout subsequent centuries and throughout the world, the Nativity scene would continue to awaken within Christians a stronger faith in the God who became visible in Jesus so that we might share in God's own family Spirit. "No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, ever at the Father's side, who has revealed him." (John 1:17).

*Areas inside the church where paint is peeling or walls are in need of some repair will be fixed. This is a lesser concern, yet important to maintain.

* Insulation will be installed under the church roof. The present insulation, which is several decades old, is insufficient, so more will be added. This two-fold project is necessary to solve the problem of varying temperatures outside and inside.
