It is UP TO YOU to make a difference. **HB 2354 could** be voted on as early as this week. There is no time to waste.

House Bill 2354 seeks to: Make abortion a fundamental right, preventing any common-sense regulation such as parental notification; expand public funding of abortion through Medicaid and possibly state health insurance plans; undermine the Illinois Health Care Right of Conscience Act protecting health care professionals and employers; and, mandate comprehensive sex education for all public schools. The bill is extreme and a radical change from current law. It is the end of the society we know. PLEASE EVERYBODY ACT NOW. Do not be silent.
