WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Fifth Sunday of Lent

When Jesus says, "Whoever who loves his life loses it; and whoever who hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life," he is not advising us to hate ourselves. Rather we are being invited to reject selfishness and my-way-orthe-highway and instead embrace the highest form of love: loving self-sacrifice.

To forget self, to deny self, to die to self — it is when we forget ourselves that we are most free and most joyful. It is in dedicated sacrifice beyond ourselves that we grow and bear fruit.

We may extend our mortal time on earth if we take things easy or preoccupy ourselves with ourselves. But it is always because people have been prepared to die to self-interest that the most precious human creations have been born.

Jesus gave us an example with his life. His life wasn't taken from him. He gave it freely out of love of the Father's will and out of love for us.

Losing and Gaining Life

Each of us is like a grain of wheat planted by God.

Just as a grain of wheat must die so as to produce a harvest, so we must "die to self" — overcome our natural selfishness — in order to bear the fruits of love.

This dying to self is a gradual process and happens in little ways.

Every act of humility involves dying to pride.

Every act of courage involves dying to cowardice.

Every act of diligence involves dying to laziness.

Every act of love involves dying to selfishness.

Thus the vain love of self dies, and we grow to be more and more Christ-like, the goal of all Christians, all followers of Christ.

Today as Christ speaks about losing and gaining life, as he uses the exam-



ple of a seed that falls to the ground, dies, grows, and then yields wheat, I ponder the problem of selfishness. Why are some people selfish? Why do they think only of themselves? Why do they often act as though no one else exists? Why is this same sin committed again and again? For centuries people followed a common wisdom, and that wisdom taught them these simple steps:

- A tight fist can neither give nor receive.
- Be generous with others because they will be your judges at the end of time.
- A selfish person makes no one happy.
- Be silent when you give, but speak up when you receive.
- One who knows how to give, knows how to love.
- Don't ask of someone what you are not willing to give.
- The person who gives only so that he will receive, gives nothing.
- Who gives from the little he has, gives from the soul. Who gives much but only from his surplus fortune, gives from his possessions.

I believe that every person is aware of his blessings. I believe that every one of us realizes that we have been given more than we deserve. Because of that I also feel that we are called to share some of our time, our talent, and our treasure with others, with our community, and with those in need. The things that are most important in life: faith, family, friends, homeland, are pure gifts. Let us not be selfish in sharing these gifts!
