
### WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Sixth Sunday of Easter

When I was a theology student, the Franciscans trained us by telling us that each person must do some spiritual reading



every day in order to keep the spirit healthy! People today take in much information and somehow that information forms them. Why does spiritual reading matter? The reading of spiritual literature such as texts of wisdom, the classic works of the spiritual fathers, the lives of the saints, or modern literature that renews a person's spirituality indicates that a person cares about the state of his or her spirituality.

It also reveals to us that there is something that will enlighten our reality, something that will give us a true vision of what is what, who is who, and how and what to choose in life. Why is this important? Because of the fact that today, when everyone is vying for our attention, trying to contact us, and to influence our thoughts, we must have sound guidelines. So many people are trying to persuade us to watch certain TV programs or visit their web sites. They all dangle various tempting attractions before us and tell us, "Come here." There are millions of offers—so very many that in order for a person to remain himself, to be true to himself, calm and collected, he must ignore those numerous attractions, look away from the daily temptations of the world and all its invitations to distraction, and enter into the realm of his spirit where there is silence, peace and wisdom. In that sacred place we will become aware of that which is lasting, eternal and worthwhile. Then we can re-enter the world. Renounce those temptations. We know who we are. Guard your family. Teach your children. Beware of temptation and evil, and resist the emptiness of glamour. Therefore, spiritual reading truly means a return to oneself.

> God, our Father, walk through my house and take away all my worries and illnesses; and please watch over and heal my family in Jesus' Name. Amen.


### St. Jerome School **Scholarships**




