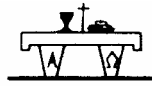

Spirit of the living God, fall afresh on us!

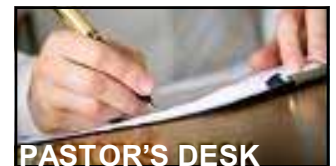
THOUGHT OF THE WEEK

Dear friends,

Let us try to put life into numbers.

Numbers are God's gift. Mathematics is a channel to perfection. It is a step by which we come to understand how everything around us functions. And so it is with human beings. Mathematics can help a person live a better quality of life. Therefore, let's play with the numbers as we ask questions about ourselves. One day has 24 hours, 1,440 minutes. One week has 7 days, 168 hours, 10,080 minutes, respectively. It is very many, isn't it? The question is how much time do we dedicate to our body — for sleeping, washing, dressing, eating, drinking, watching TV, applying makeup, etc. How much time do we spend every day on our bodies? Our bodies are God's gift. They need care and attention. That is very true. Yet how much time is left for us to read, to pray, to analyze, to think? How much time do we actually reserve for our souls on a daily basis? Since we live in an age where we calculate everything, we plan. Therefore, we have to plan some time for our souls, for our inner reality, for the spiritual base of our physical existence. It is good to calculate time for our spiritual growth so that we may reach the height of perfection. Self-analysis and calculation will bring us closer to our true selves, to our honest views, and to God's presence. It will do us good. How much time do we take every day to pray? How much time is spent every day on vanities? How often do we misuse our language? Do we talk too much? When we talk, we cannot listen to ourselves. How much time am I ready to make every day for that spiritual space? May our self-analysis of our spirituality show us the way towards God's intention — our own salvation.

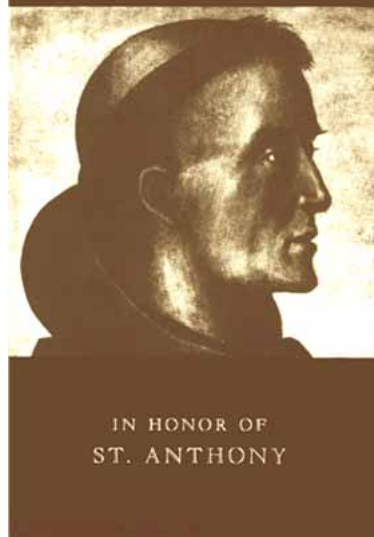
