To have work that absorbs one is a great blessing, but to have a sense of *vocation* is an even greater blessing. Jesus had it to a degree that of course we can never equal. He served out of total, unconditional love. And yet we know that love is a source of strength and energy for us

as well. We know too that where love is, there will also be self-sacrifice.
