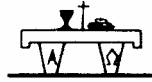

## WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Solemnity of All Saints

*“Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God,”* reads one of the Beatitudes spoken by Jesus in the Gospel reading used for All Saints Day.

are a complete reversal of conventional standards and values.

The Beatitudes are the marks of a true disciple of Jesus. They are the standards by which we measure holiness. The things the Beatitudes stand for are very beautiful and most precious — things such as peace, goodness, joy, love, gentleness, compassion, mercy, in-



tegrity. These are the qualities of goodness and sainthood.
