WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

In Biblical times, widows were among the poorest of the poor. The widow in today's first reading had a son to support. She was down to the last of her food, yet, by sharing it, she ended up with a never-ending supply of flour and oil. She represents those people who, despite poverty and oppression, place all their trust in God.

In today's Gospel, Jesus' denunciation of the pretentious public display of the Scribes provides the context for appreciating the good example on the part of the humble widow. Her example of true piety contrasts sharply with the showy piety of the Scribes. The widow let

committed herself wholly to God. Her example is more about her trust than her generosity.

A important test of a gift is not what it amounts to in itself, but what lov-

ing sacrifice on the part of the giver it demanded.

Mother Teresa told of the day she was walking down the street when a beggar came up to her and said, "Mother, everyone is giving to you. I

also want to give. Today, for the whole day, I made thirty cents. I want you to take it."

She thought for a moment: "If I take the money he will have nothing to eat tonight, and if I don't I will hurt his feelings." It was then that she put out her hand and took the money. Later, when she related the incident, she remarked that she had never seen such joy on anyone's face as on the face of the beggar as he realized that he too could give to Mother Teresa and help the poor.

Mother Teresa continued her story: "It was a big sacrifice for that poor man who had sat in the sun all day only to earn thirty cents, yet it was beautiful. Thirty cents is such a small amount and I can get nothing with it, but as he gave it up and I took it, it became like thousands because it was given with so much love."
