WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The rich young man in today's Gospel asked Jesus, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" A key question here is really: "What is the purpose of life?" The answer is "to gain eternal life."

Most of us asked the same sort of question when we were young, but as we grow older it is usually no longer a burning issue with us. Why is this? Could it be that we are so preoccupied with the baggage of life, or with its amusements and distractions that we simply have no time for *eternal* matters?

Our presence at Mass every Sunday brings us face to face with these great and important questions. We are reminded that life is a pilgrimage to God's eter-



nal kingdom, but that path calls for loving sacrifice. It challenges

us to let go of, and give up some of our "riches" in order to respond to Our Lord's invitation to follow him. We know how the rich young man responded. How do we respond...

Sacrifice? Thanks but no thanks

A young boy visited his grandfather at his blacksmith shop. The grandfather warned the boy not to touch the horseshoes because some were very hot. The child began to wander around the place and, despite grandpa's warning, picked up one of the horseshoes. Finding it burning hot, he dropped it immediately, emitting a cry as he did so. The grandpa heard the boy's cry and came to him.

"Did you hurt yourself?" he asked.

"No," the boy lied."

"Are you sure, because if you're hurting I can help you."

"No, I'm all right."

"So you didn't burn your hand?"

"No."

"Well, if you didn't, then why did you drop the horseshoe so quickly?"

"Because it didn't take long to look at it."

It doesn't take long to look at something and then drop it — as the story of the rich young man shows us.
