WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The blind man in today's Gospel, Bartimaeus, was in a sad state. Blindness is a terrible affliction. His situation seemed hopeless, and yet there was one area in which he was most fortunate — he had faith in Jesus. It may have been a desperate faith, but it was a genuine faith and faith is what matters.

Yet, there is a darkness worse

than that of Baritmaeus. It is the darkness of unbelief. It cuts us off more than physical blindness can. Bartimaeus was in darkness until he met Jesus. We are in darkness when we hate, when we live in error, when we choose evil.

Thus we can make our own prayer the heart-felt prayer of Bartimaeus: "Lord, that I may



see." We ask Our Lord that we may see what is truly important in life, and above all, that we may see with the eyes of faith."

The Jesus Prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on us sinners."

Blind faith

Mrs. William Stafford was 35 years old and the mother of four children ranging from 2 to 12 years old when she was told she would never see again. She remained totally blind for the remainder of her life.

"It was during the Depression," she recalled. "My husband was a low-salaried worker, so there never was



any question of obtaining hired help. When I realized it was a case of either Joan, my oldest child, missing an

education or my doing the housework, I knew that even if I had to crawl around on my hands and knees, the children must go to school."

Determined to find a way to help herself despite her blindness, she learned to do all her household chores by herself. She kept the home so clean and neat that a stranger, watching her move about, might never guess that she was blind.

Asked how she was able to handle this unfortunate disability and still maintain her family and her positive attitude she said, "Prayer and my Catholic faith have been my great solace."

Very often in encounters with individuals or families, we priests come into contact with problems that are known as addictions. In our society it is as if they have become epidemics: addictions to drugs, alcohol, lying, gambling, uncontrolled viewing of television, the internet, pornography, and many other bad things that cause changes in the character of a person. To be addicted to a particular thing means that a person cannot live without it, and that it will alter who you are as a person.

How can we change this situation? What can be done?

- It is more than clear that the first step in this process of conquering the addiction is to admit the problem and to admit that help is needed.
- 2. The second important step is to seek help.
- The third step is to continue to receive the necessary help until one is free of the addiction, cured, or recovered and released from all of its "chains."
- 4. No one can do this alone. Everyone needs help with addictions, and everyone must offer help to those who suffer from addictions. Be a compassionate Good Samaritan who is concerned about others. If we save even one person, we save an entire life!

Together, we take care of each other. If we priests can help, let us know — call, send an email, or come to see us. We are here with you and for you.
