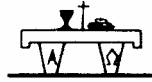

WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel Jesus leaves no doubt as to what the ideal marriage ought to be—"What God has joined together, no human being must separate." But he was deeply aware of and sympathetic toward the problems that arise in human life.

In marriage God answered the human need for friendship, companionship, closeness and

warmth—all those things we long for. But human relationships have to be worked on. They can suffer from neglect just as surely as a garden does.

Indissoluble monogamy is not just a God-given ideal. It even finds a powerful justification in the special needs of us human beings to be nurtured and cared for over a much, much longer

period of time than any species of the animal kingdom.

It is a great challenge to love throughout life, and few things provide a greater opportunity for such growth than marriage.

Indeed, the difficulties encountered in marriage can become — with Jesus' help — great opportunities to strengthen and deepen such a lifetime of love.

WISDOM'S CORNER

Commitment or convenience?

A rabbi was discussing the impending wedding with the young couple. At one point the young man said to him, "Rabbi, would you object if we made one small change in the wedding ceremony? Instead of 'till death do us part', could you say 'for as long as love lasts'? Both of us feel that it wouldn't be morally right for us to be stuck together if it should happen that we no longer love each other."

The rabbi replied, "I *do* object, and I won't make the change. You and I know that many marriages do not last until one of the partners dies, but let me tell you something. If you go into marriage with an attitude of 'If it doesn't work out, we can always split,' then I can almost *guarantee* that things won't work out for you. I appreciate your feeling, but you must understand that a marriage commitment is not just a mutual willingness to live together, but a total commitment to accept the frustrations and disappointments that are an inevitable part of two imperfect human beings relating to each other. If only *a part of you* is involved in the relationship — even if that's 'all of you' for a *partial* period of the rest of your life — then you are surely certain to fail."
