WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

We read in today's Gospel about the trouble Jesus went to on behalf of the deaf and mute man, and the care with which he dealt with him.

This miracle has great relevance for most of us not because we are physically deaf or mute, but because most of us do have the gifts of hearing and speech. The

fact that we possess these gifts, however, doesn't guarantee that we use them as we should.

A fate worse than being deaf is to have well-functioning ears and *refuse* to hear, or to have an able tongue but refuse to speak. We need the Lord's healing touch if we are to use these

gifts well.

A person could have perfect hearing, and yet not listen to the word of God, or have perfect speech, but refuse to make an act of faith.

As the Parable of the Sower reminds us, the word of God, when heard and acted upon, is like a seed falling on good soil; it makes our lives fruitful.

WISDOM'S CORNER

Precious Gifts

The gift of hearing is a precious gift,

But it is only with the heart that we can hear rightly.

The cry of a needy person may reach our ears, but unless it reaches our heart, we will not feel the person's pain, and it is unlikely that we will respond.

The gift of speech is a precious gift, but again it is only with the heart that we can speak rightly.

For our words to ring true, they must come from the heart.

If they come only from the lips, they will have a hollow sound and will have a likewise superficial effect.

They will be like a wind that ruffles the surface of the water but leaves the depths untouched.

Words that come from the heart can enter someone else's heart.

The Wounds of Christ on St. Francis's body

Francis was a man of prayer. Perhaps his greatest moment of ecstatic and mystical prayer took place on La Verna, a mountain miles north of Assisi. There, some two years before he died, he was in prayer during the month of September in 1224. A seraph (which is one of the highest types of angels) appeared to him in the form of a crucified man. Two wings met above the head, two covered the rest of the body to the feet, and two were spread as in flight. From this time on Francis bore the marks of the wounds of Christ on his own body, on his hands, feet and side.

Francis tried to conceal these marks, but they did become known to his brothers and perhaps some others close to him. Much has been written about this stigmata of Francis and rightfully so. Those who prayerfully accept this transformation in the body of Francis, recognize the value of the external marks. The marks brought to the surface what Francis most dearly treasured within himself — his being one with the crucified but risen Christ. Francis wanted the mystery within himself to be proclaimed, but feared that some might be attracted to only the external signs. The true follower of Francis accepts the external signs as a way of entering more deeply into the mystery of Christ, which all the baptized bear within themselves. "Henceforth, let no one trouble me, for I bear the brand marks of Jesus in my body." (Galatians 6:17)
