#### WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel we see the apostles fighting over who would be Number One in the Kingdom. They are driven by selfishness and false ambition — showing how much more they would have to learn from Jesus' unselfish sacrifice on the cross. So Jesus called them together and patiently explained the meaning of true greatness.

Jesus did not abolish ambition, rather, he redirected it. In place of the ambition to rule over others by domination, he substituted the ambition to serve others by bringing them closer to God. The ambition to have others do things for us, he redirected into the ambition to do things for others. So, it is not "ambition" itself that is being

condemned, but false and selfish ambition.

Selfish ambition is very damaging to the unity of any community, but especially one directed toward God.

The good form of ambition is found unselfishly serving others (especially those who are most vulnerable) out of our abundant love for God and neighbor.

Francis was a man of earth and a man of heaven. He was born into this world in 1181 or 1182, died in 1226, and lived most of his life in the area of Assisi in Italy. He walked on the earth and looked up to the sky. In his limited time and space he encountered many other living creatures. This certainly puts him into the time and space that constitutes this world. He was also baptized into Christ shortly after his birth and experienced a radical conversion in 1205. His life after that was an unveiling of the presence of God, who in turn drew Francis more intensely into the mystery of the love of the Holy Trinity. Prayer and worship enabled him to see so clearly that he, through Christ who became incarnate, was living in the intimate presence of God. This helps us to comprehend how Francis, who so disdained the world as an end in itself, could so appreciate the beauty of creation as an entrance in God's mysterious presence. Francis would not allow creation itself to capture him, but he welcomed creation as drawing him into the mystery of God. Indeed, Francis walked through life with one eye looking at the earth, but the other gazing into the mystery that is beyond our human vision. He looked at earth, but gazed into God.
