The word *hypocrite* comes from Middle English *hypocrite*, from Anglo-French, from Late Latin *hypocrita*, from Greek *hypokritēs* "actor", "hypocrite", from *hypokrinesthai*. First Known Use in English: 13th century.

A hypocrite is a person who acts in contradiction to his or her stated beliefs or feelings (Webster's dictionary)

The dictionary defines a hypocrite as someone who "pretends to be better than he really is or to be pious, virtuous without really being so." A hypocrite is someone who says one thing and does the opposite. One of the main reasons people have double standards is that they desire to have the best of both worlds. They go to church on Sundays and as soon as they walk out the door, they go back to living their "regular" lives. "Do the right thing" doesn't mean to do that which best serves our lustful desires. A lack of respect for the seducing nature of sin has led many to live hypocritical lives. In our heart of hearts, we know full well that something is morally wrong with our actions, but we do it anyway because it feels good or is convenient. The people committing hypocritical acts normally try to use some form of rationalization to justify their actions. (T.S.)
