WEEKLY MEDITATION for Third Sunday of Advent

Today's readings invite us to rejoice at the rebirth of Jesus in our lives as we are preparing for our annual Christmas celebration. Today is called *Gaudete* Sunday because today's Mass begins with the opening antiphon: "Gaudete in domino semper," or in English., "Rejoice in the Lord always." So we light the rose-colored candle on the Advent wreath.

The Gospel teaches us something important: John the Baptist had pro-

phetically called Jesus the "Lamb of God," and, in today's Gospel, Jesus says that "among those born of women" there has been no greater prophet than John the Baptist.

And yet when he was imprisoned, John the Baptist asks Jesus through a messenger, "Are you the one who is to come or should we look for another?"

In prison, John had serious questions. When we go through difficult times and have serious questions, John

shows that it is good to turn to someone who knows how to answer questions of faith correctly. In hard times, we do not doubt our faith, but in faith we do have questions. We trust in Jesus. We have no doubt about him. We have no doubt that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to guide his Church united with the Pope into everdeeper understanding of the serious questions.

Questions in good faith are good. A thousand questions don't amount to one doubt.

WISDOM'S CORNER

Advent reconciliation

All of us together, with our joys, our fears, our differences . . . all of us together, with our hopes, our dreams, our faults . . . all of us together, many though one, are called to love. Together we form a circle of love. This circle has no beginning and no end.

At times this circle of love is broken because of selfishness, because of prejudice and because we ignore the deepest stirrings that go on in all of us.

We find ourselves creating separate circles: the inner circle, the outer circle, the circle of power, and the circle of despair.

We carefully define our circles at work and at home.

Some circles nourish; other circles are destructive. The circle of love is broken where there is alienation, misunderstanding, and a hardening of our hearts.

The circle of love is broken where we can't see eye-to-eye or we can't live heart-to-heart.
