Heard of abstaining from meat once a week?





There is a movement in America called *weekly* vegetarian. Sounds a bit funny, right? People who are a part of this are using diet as their fight against global warming. According to U.N. reports, the livestock industry produces 18 percent of the world's greenhouse gasses. These part-time vegetarians choose what to eat and when. The popular "meatless Monday" movement, which began in 2003, has been backed by, of course, many celebrities. The city of Ghent in Belgium picked Thursday as its veggie day, calling for meat-free options to be served on that day in schools and other public institutions.

Wow! It took them so many years to figure this out; they are behind us Catholics. We haven't been eating meat one day of the week for centuries.

Peter Singer, a Princeton University professor of philosophy even wrote on the topic in his book "Animal Liberation." They are truly late on this, but maybe they want to use our Catholic idea secretly. It's funny. Did you notice how they first took Monday, then those Belgians took Thursday, now some weekly-vegetarians might take Tuesday as their day without meat, but notice how they did not take *Friday* — perhaps because then they would have to get copyright permission from us! Statistics from the American Dietetic Association say that only 2.5 percent of the American population is vegetarian. Sincerely, I thought it was more. I do love vegetarians. I think they are right, but sometimes due to a wrong premise. St. John the Baptist was a vegetarian. St. Matthew tells us this Sunday (Mt 3:1-12) that John lived in the desert, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Many, many saintly mystics did the same. They all had something in common — which we have called for centuries: "fasting." Did we forget about this? It would be a real pity if we did. Not to eat meat once a week on Friday is mystical, spiritual, healthy, and in accordance with our tradition. John the Baptist can help us this Sunday as well.
