WEEKLY MEDITATION for the First Sunday in Lent

Jesus' victory over Satan in the desert was no once-andfor-all victory. He had won a battle, not the war. There would be other attacks that would need to be repelled. The same is true for us.

In this life, temptations never cease forever. They return at opportune times. Temptations continued through Jesus' life as the tempter sought in vain to undermine his mission. Even as he hung on the cross, we hear an echo of the third temptation: "If

he is the Messiah, let him come down from the cross, and we will believe in him."

All those who are struggling to live a good life can take



heart. Resisting temptation was not easy for Jesus, nor will it be for us, but in Jesus we have a brother who knows what we are up

against. When we fall, he offers us forgiveness and the strength to get up again. He helps us obey God's word and to worship him alone.

"Karl Rabeder has been rich and poor. 'Poor is better,' he says. The Austrian millionaire, who



made his fortune from an interior furnishings and accessories business, is giving away his nearly \$5 million fortune and planning to repair to a small wooden hut in the mountains, <u>The Daily Telegraph of London reports</u>. 'My idea is to have nothing left,' he said. 'Absolutely nothing. Money is counterproductive – it prevents happiness to come.' Mr. Rabeder, 47, has sold his business and is selling his villa in the Austrian Alps and his farmhouse in Provence. The money will go to charities he set up in Central and South America. But Mr. Rabeder said he did not judge those who keep their wealth. 1 was just listening to the voice of my heart and soul.'" (N.Y. Times, 2/14/2010).

He continues to confirm that he doesn't pass judgments nor does he judge those who are wealthy, but quite simply he listened to the voice of his heart and soul. He was in the frame of mind to reject everything around him. This Lent, it may be too much to ask of many, but it is certainly important to ask the probing questions brought up by Lent itself and with a little help from this short story from the paper: What do I have in life that I do not need? Can I get rid of these extra things? Have I become dependent on things that really are not important? Do I have more time for things than people, for technology and the internet than my family, friends, spouse or children? Lent makes us ask and think about these questions. And Lent seeks not only answers, but also lasting attitudes and dispositions. Mr. Rabeder had it all, and a lot of it, but he was still unhappy... the voice in his heart and soul spoke differently...the message is simple. God is always talking, and all we have to do is listen.
