WEEKLY MEDITATION for *Corpus Christi* Sunday

In today's Gospel, after speaking to the crowd and healing the sick, Jesus worked a great miracle to feed them. The miracle of the five loaves — when Jesus took the bread, gave thanks to the Father, broke the bread and gave it to feed the multitude — this prefigures the superabundance of the living bread he gives us in the Eucharist.

The early Christians met "to

break bread" at Mass, after having heard the Word of God. From that time on, the celebration of the Eucharist has continued, so that

today we encounter it everywhere in the Church with the same fundamental structure: Word and Eucharist. It remains the center of the Church's life.

The faithful of the Church are I



the Mystical Body of Christ. Jesus is in our midst. We hear him when the Bible is read. In Confession, he forgives

our sins and heals the wounds they leave. We are nourished by the Eucharist. And at the end of Mass we are sent forth as bearers of Christ to others, bearers of his sacrificial love.
