In the form of tongues of fire, the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples, individually and

The same Spirit descends on us at our Baptism, and his gifts are opened up for us at our Confirmation. The Spirit is not given for a moment, but is meant to accompany us on our journey in



the footsteps of Jesus. The Holy Spirit gives us the strength and wisdom to participate in the work of Jesus. The Holy Spirit

brings strength in times of sadness and helps us open the gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and reverence.

A new language

On Pentecost day the apostles spoke a new language.

- It was the language of peace rather than war;
- the language of cooperation rather than of competition;
- the language of forgiveness rather than of vengeance;

- the language of friendship rather than of hostility;

Last week I shared with you a story about a booklet entitled "Muslim Cultural Sensitivity in Public Schools." The booklet was distributed to Chicago Public School teachers. As I studied it a little bit more, I found out that the same booklet was distributed in public schools in the last school year 2008-2009 entitled "Muslim Cultural Sensitivity and Education in Public Schools." It is noticeable that the one from the previous year is shorter than this year's. Progress is obvious! They instruct teachers in public school how to approach Muslim students, e.g., during the month of Ramadan. The guide is very practical:



PASTOR'S DESK

1. "Students might feel tired, especially the first few days of their fast.
2. Students might request to sit separately from other students at lunch time.
3. Students might request to do an alternative assignment for physical education classes.
4. Students may attend the daily evening prayer service at the mosque (prayer center) which lasts approximately 1-2 hours. Students may become tired with repeated attendance. This may affect daily homework time.
5. During this month there is a higher level of socializing within the Muslim community due to dinners offered by friends and family. Once the daily fast is completed, a time of great festivity is often felt.

We understand that this month should not hinder the educational learning of the student, but we ask that teachers be supportive of their students during this time. If you would like more information, please do not hesitate to contact us. We would be very happy to arrange for a presentation to either your staff or your students..."

This trip would take place during the first half of November of 2011, which is 18 months from now. We will visit the most sacred places of our Catholic faith: Bethlehem, Nazareth, Capernaum, Jerusalem, Galilee, and others. The cost of the trip will be about \$3,000.00, for approximately 10 days. The price and dates will be confirmed as soon as we know the details of the trip. Included in the cost are the airfare, hotel accommodations, buses, daily breakfast and dinner, and all the sights of the Holy Land.
