WISDOM'S CORNER

What happened to them?

Have you ever wondered what happened to the 56 men who signed the Declaration of Independence?

Five signers were captured by the British as traitors, and tortured before they died. Twelve had their homes ransacked and burned. Two lost their sons serving in the Revolutionary Army; another had two sons captured. Nine of the 56 fought and died from wounds or hardships of the Revolutionary War.

They signed and they pledged their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor. What kind of men were they?

Twenty-four were lawyers and jurists. Eleven were merchants, nine were farmers and large plantation owners; men of means, well educated. But they signed the Declaration of Independence knowing full well that the penalty would be death if they were captured.

Q: Christians seem to be under attack. Is that true?



Dear friends,

Today's Gospel is so important and so true. Jesus says that people will be persecuted because of his name.

We read in the news:

- ◆ This year: 500 Christians killed in Nigeria. While the attackers were chanting Allah Akbar!
- ◆ In the period of one year from 2008 to 2009, 176,000 Christians were killed because they believed in Christ. It is almost difficult to believe to be happening in 21st century
- ◆ 200 million Christians in 60 countries lack human rights just because of their faith and traditions.
- ◆ 1.5 million Christians lived in Iraq before the war; today less than half that remain, less than 500,000. Every day they have to escape death threats.
- ◆ In Iran, Muslims who convert to Christianity are for that reason alone sentenced to death.
- ◆ Attacks against Christians and their values are more and more common in the West (America and Europe). Mocking against Catholics in movies, cartoons, magazines, papers, discussions is more and more common...
- ◆ In Europe: the famous Jewish intellectual Bernard-Henri Lévy, an atheist, said in a recent interview in the Spanish paper ABC: "The Pope's voice is extremely important. And we are very unjust to this Pope. I am not Catholic, but I think there is prejudice and especially major anti-clericalism that is taking on enormous proportions in Europe."

Jesus said (in Luke 21: 19): "You will be hated by all because of my name!"
