Benjamin Franklin's message

The epitaph of Benjamin Franklin: In one of his lighter moments, Benjamin Franklin (one of the most important Founding Fathers of the United States, author, political theorist, politician, printer, scientist, inventor, civic activist, and diplomat) penned his own epitaph for his tombstone. It seems he must have been influenced by St. Paul's teaching on the resurrection of the body. Here's what he wrote:

*"The Body of B. Franklin,
the former printer lies here,
food for worms,
like the cover of an old book:
its contents torn out,*

*and stripped of its lettering and gilding.
But the work shall not be wholly lost:
for it will, as he believed, appear once
more in a new & more perfect edition,
corrected and amended by its Author."*
