us be filled with daily thanksgiving to God and to others for the countless gifts we have received.

#### Mary, the Mother of Jesus, the Mother of God

#### Dear Friends.



A parishioner wrote the following question for Fr. Ivan and me to address in this column: **Do Baptists believe in the Blessed Virgin Mary, and what about the other Protestant denominations?** 

First of all, unlike the Roman Catholic Church, the Protestant churches do not have unchanging and universal beliefs about the Blessed Virgin Mary. For one thing, among the 800 million or so Protestants worldwide, there are more than 33,000 denominations. Moreover, within each denomination there is gradual evolution, and sometimes revolution, in their teaching on Mary, and almost everything else. So, in addressing the question of what do "Baptists" believe, or "Protestants" believe, it is impossible to do justice to their beliefs because of the wide variety of their beliefs.

For example, Martin Luther, the father of Protestantism, had a high esteem for Mary. A decade after he declared his Protestant principles, Luther preached on the Conception of the Mother of God: "It is a sweet and pious belief that the infusion of Mary's soul was effected without original sin; so that in the very infusion of her soul she was also purified from original sin and adorned with God's gifts, receiving a pure soul infused by God; thus from the first moment she began to live she was free from all sin." By and large, Protestantism has evolved away from its founder's beliefs on Mary.

For the most part, Protestants believe that Mary was a virgin when she gave birth to Jesus, because that is what the Bible clearly states. They usually agree that Jesus is God, because the Bible states that he is the Word made flesh, and the Word was God. Protestants who are lavpersons generally do not conclude that because Mary is the mother of Jesus, who is God, therefore she is the Mother of God. But educated Protestant ministers usually concede that **she** is the **Mother** of **God**, because they usually embrace the early church councils that declared her to be the Mother of God — educated ministers don't want to be heretics in the eyes of the Council of Ephesus! So with education, there is hope that Protestants will not misunderstand the Catholic beliefs on Mary. They can see we ask her to pray for us to her Son, Jesus. They can see that on the Cross, Jesus gave her to his Beloved Disciple as his mother — and if we too are Jesus' beloved disciples, as we are, then we too can receive from Jesus his mother as our spiritual mother. Mary can bring us all together, which is the wish of every mother for her children.
