- ◆ The huge special parking lot under the Dan Ryan highway at 27th Street between Wells St. & Wentworth Ave.

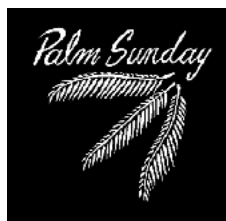
Please park so that with a little extra walking things can be better for everyone!
