But there is the Shrine of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem, and pilgrims from all over the world visit a tomb there which is empty, with a note at its entrance which says, "He is not here." It is famous because Jesus Christ who was once buried there rose from the dead, leaving an empty tomb — as he had told his disciples he would. Thus, he worked the most important miracle in his life, defying the laws of nature and proving that he is God.

We rejoice at this great and unique event by celebrating Easter.
