WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 4th Sunday of Lent

Peter Marshall, chaplain to the U.S. Congress in the late 1940s, used to pray, *"Give us clear vision that we may know where to stand and what to stand for, because unless we stand for something, we shall fall for anything."*

Today's Gospel is about our ability to see clearly. Do we fail to see God at work in our

lives because He has shown us no obvious miracles? Do we fail to see God at work even in the lives of people who are seen as outcasts, such as drug addicts?

Jonathan Swift wrote in the 1700s that, "Vision is the art of seeing things invisible." Let us remember that

Let us pray for the grace to see and experience the good presence of our loving and forgiving God.

In his book *God's Annoying Love for Imperfect People*, Michael Yaconeli tells the story of a man recently converted to Jesus and how an unbelieving friend sought to "see" why. "So you have been converted to Christ?" "Yes." "Then you must know a great deal about him. Tell me, what country was he born in?" "I don't know." "What was his age when he died?" "I don't know." "How many sermons did he preach?" "I don't know." "You certainly know very little for a man who claims to be converted to Christ." "You are right. I am ashamed at how little I know about him. But this much I know: Three years ago I was a drunkard. I was in debt. My family was falling to pieces; they dreaded the sight of me. But now I have given up drink. We are out of debt. Ours is a happy home. My children eagerly await my return home each evening. All this Christ has done for me. This much I know of Christ."

What exactly is the Anointing of the Sick?



Dear Friends,

We Catholics frequently have the wrong perceptions, incorrect thoughts about many things, especially the sacraments.

Incorrect thinking or ignorance simply comes from lack of knowledge, unfamiliarity, a lack of understanding of basic concepts. Many misunderstandings between people take place because of such a lack of knowing something. Not knowing something at the same time leads to doing something incorrectly.

When we talk about the Anointing of the Sick, many Catholics think that it's about an anointing that is supposed to take place 5 minutes before someone dies. WRONG! Because of this misunderstanding, many call their priest in a hurry to give this sacrament before the person dies. O Vanity! O Emptiness! They should learn that the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament that heals and restores. Through this sacrament we open ourselves to Christ's healing power to help us, to make us whole again, to heal our body, spirit and heart, to make us happy and healthy once again.

After the Masses next weekend, we will offer the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to those seeking healing, an event where Christ's healing power penetrates body and soul. Therefore, let us think more seriously about this sacrament offered to help us live better!
