## WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 6th Sunday of Ordinary Time — Deep down righteousness

Jesus says in today's Gospel, "Unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven." Jesus does not want us to be satisfied if our outward appearance looks good our words and our deeds. He wants us to go deeper. We must have the courage to search our hearts. We need to look at what is going on inside us — at our thoughts, intentions, attitudes, and desires. When all is said and done, it is *the heart* that matters when it comes to righteousness.

The heart, the spiritual heart, is what I am deep down. It is the real me. The state of the heart will deeply affect how I live, whether I relate to God and others righteously or not. We need to strive for goodness of heart. We can't go any deeper than that. Then our good words and deeds will flow from what we are deep down, as naturally as good fruit come from a good tree. They will come from the heart.

One of the best things we can say about anyone is that he or she is good-hearted. And what is in the heart is what you truly are.

Somebody asked Charles Darwin, the main originator of the theory of evolution, the question: "Is there anything that is true only of man."

Dear Friends,

We are collecting documents and other items for our archives as we journey toward St. Jerome's centennial. One of our parishioners, Mr. John Aranza, has been very generous in providing photos and documents for us. Among the items in this collection, I was fascinated by a letter that his grandfather, Josip Aranza, wrote to John's dad, John Duje Aranza, in 1929. Here are some short parts of the last letter he wrote to his son:

"Hold onto to love because where there is love, there is God and where there is God, there is peace, and where there is peace there is God's blessing, and where there is God's blessing there is contentment. We Catholics are required to attend Mass every Sunday and the Holy Days, if possible. If it is not possible, then pray by yourself, because the Mass is a pillar for sustaining love. I love you and wish you all the best. Do not be surprised by the way I am writing to you because I only know that if you practice this you will be happy on this earth. Please do not destroy this letter because I am afraid that I will not be able to send any more. My eyes are not good, and glasses do not help, but thanks be to God. And now please accept our heartfelt greeting and I remain loving you."

How beautiful are these words. They are timeless because these values are timeless. We can always learn much from our mothers' and fathers' wisdom and from our grandparents and the generations before us. As we travel toward the centennial, it is important to look back and be grateful.
