WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 7th Sunday of Ordinary Time — Love Thy Enemies

By what do you measure a person? Holiness is a good measure.

After all, since God is holy, we are to be holy. We are holy when we imitate the generosity of God by, among other things, not exacting vengeance, or bearing a grudge against one another. In our reading today from the Book of Leviticus, the commandment "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" is restricted to fellow Israelites, but Jesus broadened the command to include everyone: Gentiles as well as Jews, enemies as well as friends. Why?

This is the way the heavenly Father acts! He shows love toward good and bad, not because he is indifferent to immorality, but because he loves without limit. Our challenge is to return his love.

St. Paul gives us a profound reason why we should respect one another: We are the temple of God. Individually and collectively the Holy Spirit dwells in us. This is also the basis of our church's unity.

WISDOM'S CORNER

Hatred versus the gift of love

The great Roman Catholic writer G.K. Chesterton wrote more than a 100 years ago these still-fresh words: "The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting. It has been found difficult; and left untried." More than any other, the exhortation to love one's enemies has been left untried.

Hate poisons the heart; love purifies it. Jesus says to us, "Love your enemies." It is not only for the sake of the enemy that he says this but for our sake too. For one thing, love is more beautiful than hate. The greatest gift we possess is the gift to love. There is one thing that can destroy the gift of love, and that is hatred.

We consume more energy in hating than in all our other activities. It creates a legacy of bitterness, hostility, and resentment. Christ's way is a better way. It is not a soft way. It's a difficult way that calls for great strength and toughness. The person who is truly non-violent, who is incapable of violence, is a person who is fearless, who is at peace in the peace of Christ.
