WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 5th Sunday of Ordinary Time

You are the salt and the light of the world

Jesus outlines the role of us Christians in this world: we are to be salt and light.

As a symbol of purity, salt was a common ingredient in sacrifices



offered to God by Jews and even by pagans. In the ancient world, salt was the commonest of all preservatives, used to prevent spoilage of meat, fish and some fruits of the earth. Salt also lends flavor to food.

A light is something meant to be seen. A lamp or light is a guide to make clear the way to go. A light serves also as a warning of what to avoid (e.g., red traffic lights tell us to halt when danger lies ahead). Finally, light, particularly the Sun's, gives warmth.

The exorcist behind the new movie

Dear Friends,

I saw a good movie recently, "The Rite."

Fr. Gary Thomas, whose real-life experience as an exorcist-in-training is chronicled in the movie, praised it for its positive portrayal of the Church and for its witness to the power of faith. The movie, starring Oscar-winning actor Anthony Hopkins and newcomer Colin O'Donoghue, is loosely based on Fr. Thomas's experience traveling to Rome and studying under an Italian exorcist in 2005. The movie is based on journalist Matt Baglio's 2009 book, "The Rite: The making of a modern exorcist." Baglio befriended Fr. Gary Thomas while in Rome and chronicled the priest's studies at the Pontifical North American College and his eventual apprenticeship with a local exorcist.

It is exceptionally well done movie. Fr. Thomas spent some time on the movie set. The producer wanted the movie to be as accurate as possible. "The producer and the two key actors all asked me privately if they could be attacked [by the Devil] by doing this movie," Fr. Thomas said. "I said, I can't absolutely say yes or no – which lead me to say 'possibly.'"

I strongly recommend to all of you to see the movie. It is powerful. "This is a movie about faith," said Fr. Thomas. "People are going to be very surprised."

Bl. Stepinac's feast day

This weekend at the 11 a.m. Mass and afterward in the Parish Hall, our parish will celebrate Blessed Cardinal Alojzije Stepinac, the archbishop of Zagreb, Croatia, who was born May 8, 1898 and died Feb. 10, 1960. For refusing the Yugoslavian Communists' demand that he break away from the Pope and form an independent Croatian Catholic church, Blessed Stepinac was subjected to a fraudulent show trial, imprisonment and poisoning, which led to a martyr's death. Pope John Paul II beatified him in 1998, designating February 10, which is this Thursday, as Bl. Stepinac's feast day. Our right side-altar honors him.

Progress in finding St. Jerome treasures

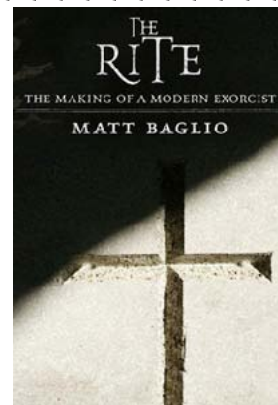
A big thank you to all of you who have already searched attics and photo albums for relics from the past of St. Jerome's. Among the other items that
