passion: a story of a man who lent his tools to someone in need, or a woman who helped her neighbors.

Jesus says that such peo-



ple will inherit God's kingdom rather than the worldly wise who pride themselves on their intellec-

tual achievements but do not love.

As we celebrate the 4th of July, let us be humble, knowing how much is given to us.

President Dwight David Eisenhower knew about inner peace from God. He had it even while he was the leader of Allied armed forces in World War II. His every decision during that awful conflict had monumental consequences. Take, for example, the burden of deciding when D-Day would be.

How did he deal with the pressure? Ike shared with his former pastor, Dean Miller, that he didn't try to carry his burden alone.

Some nights when the strain became too great, Eisenhower would simply pray: "Lord, with your grace I've done the best I can. You take over until morning." And he understood very well Jesus' advice in today's Gospel: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28)

Japan comes to my mind. Tsunami, earthquake... people waiting in long lines, calm, no stealing, no robberies, no burglaries, no violence...

Is our culture tired? Or are we morally on the wrong track?
