The Pope in Croatia

Dear Friends,



What a time of great excitement!

Last weekend in Croatia, the Pope once again showed the strength of his Spirit, greatness in humility, and he fascinated the people.

On Saturday he spoke at the main theater in Zagreb before an audience of people who were representatives of key sectors of civil society. It is interesting that among all of the topics he could have spoken about, he chose the topic of conscience. The Pope, an intellectual, a writer, a professor, a Doctor of Science, chose to speak about this essential issue of our times: conscience. How significant is that!

The most beautiful event during the Pope's visit took place at the main square in Zagreb, where over 20,000 young people were gathered. Pope Benedict himself commented on how he was fascinated with the silence, despite the great mass of people. He said that in the heart of the city, he could hear the birds singing! He was simply amazed by this. This main square is busy and noisy at all hours, but that evening, they all prayed together — the youth and the Pope. During Eucharistic adoration, all that was heard was the birds' songs. What a heavenly feeling!

The following day, the Pope celebrated Mass at Zagreb's racecourse with 400,000 people. The Pope spoke in both Croatian and Italian. All who were there were greatly affected and deeply moved. The people who I have spoken with over the last few days were radiating hope, and were grateful for the gift of grace. The grace they received by being there, and the grace through the encounters they shared. It is beautiful to be Catholic and to share our faith with the world. Spirituality does not recognize borders, languages, nor cultures; it is simply God's grace within us.

A few Papal words on conscience, spoken in the Croatian National Theater in Zagreb last Saturday:

... This brings us back to conscience as the keystone on which to base a culture and build up the common good. It is by forming consciences that the Church makes her most specific and valuable contribution to society. It is a contribution that begins in the family and is strongly reinforced in the parish, where infants, children and young people learn to deepen their knowledge of the sacred Scriptures... At the same time, they learn what it means for a community to be built upon gift, not upon economic interests or ideology, but upon love, [which is] the principal driving force behind the authentic development of every person and of all humanity.

This logic of [giving unconditionally], learnt in infancy and adolescence, is then lived out in every area of life: in games, in sport, in interpersonal relations, in art, in voluntary service to the poor and the suffering. And once it has been assimilated, it can be applied to the most complex areas of political and economic life so as to build up a [society] that is welcoming and hospitable, but at the same time not empty, not falsely neutral, but rich in humanity, with a strongly ethical dimension. It is here that the *lay faithful* are called to give generously of the formation they have received, guided by the principles of the Church's Social Doctrine, for the sake of: authentic secularism; social justice; the defense of life and of the family; freedom of religion; and education.

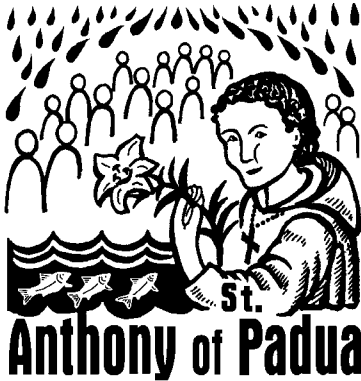
