PASTOR'S DESK The most beautiful and best life

is one that inspires others to do good. That was the kind of life lived and witnessed by Pope John Paul II. During his 27 years as pope he visited 129 countries,

and, in Italy alone, 146 places. He met with more people than all the popes before him: almost 18 million people participated in his papal audiences (1,160 audiences) on Wednesdays at St. Peter's Square in Vatican City. He met millions of people on his trips; he had 738 meetings with presidents, 246 with prime ministers. He established the international gatherings known as "World Youth Day," where he met millions of young people in places all around the world. He established "World Day For Families," where he met millions of families. He searched for examples and inspirations of holiness in every culture and language and proclaimed 1,338 individuals "Blessed" and 482 were canonized as saints. He wrote 14 encyclicals, 11 apostolic constitutions, 45 apostolic letters and many other books and reflections.

He established the Feast of Divine Mercy on the Second Sunday of Easter, and it was on the evening before that feast when he passed away: Easter Saturday, April 2, 2005. More than 3 million people came to Vatican City over 5 days to pay their respects and to express their gratitude to this great man of our time. He is known for being bold and straightforward, for speaking the Truth, for the fall of communism, for peace talks, for connecting and bringing closer many nations and religions, and for his famous greeting: "Do not be afraid. Open your door to Christ!" May he be an inspiration to us and intercede for us.
