

WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Third Sunday of Easter

In times of need

In today's Gospel, Jesus helped his sad followers walking on the road to Emmaus. This incident tells us how God will not leave us alone when we are hurt and disappointed. A key message in today's readings is that the followers of Jesus are to maintain contact with Jesus through the Word of God and through the Eucharist. The Risen Lord meets us on the road to our "Emmaus," in the places to which we *retreat* when life is too much for us. The place we retreat to when we fall terribly short of our hopes and dreams about health, healing, financial security and better family relationships. Today's Gospel alerts us that Jesus may come to us when we least expect him, and



we might not recognize his presence and support. Such "Emmaus moments" come to us when we meet and deepen our relationship with Jesus on our life's journey through rough times.

'Mom, was that Jesus?'

Years ago, when people used to travel from city to city on railroad trains, a little girl took her first trip on an overnight train.

The girl was put into an upper berth by her mother. The mother then assured her that Jesus would watch over her during the night. As the interior lights were switched off, the girl became alarmed and called out softly: "Mom, are you there?" "Yes, dear," her mother replied. A little later the child called in a louder voice: "Daddy, are you also there?" "Yes," was the reply.

After this had been repeated several times, one of the passengers lost patience and shouted: "We're all here. Your father, your mother, your brothers and sisters and cousins, your uncles and aunts – all are here. Now go to sleep!"

There was silence for a while. Then, in a hushed voice the child asked: "Mom, was that Jesus?"

A Mother's Letter, From Around 1909



Dear Friends,

This Sunday is Mother's Day. We share with you a mother's letter to her son, who was in our parish. The letter was probably written in 1909, in the Dalmatian region of Croatia, and was mailed to Chicago, expressing a mother's thoughts. Amid other matters in the letter, the mother tells her adult son:

"I always recommend that you take care of yourself and I hope that this advice will stay with you. My dear son, I always commend you in prayer and I would like that you do the same, and then I hope that nothing bad will happen to you. Your father and I want to know how you are over there. Write to us more often. Are you satisfied with everything? Is your job hard? Is it too strict? How are you sleeping, eating, and drinking? Write to us all about it. Do you have good friends? Do you still go to school? Please answer all of our questions. Are you still happy that you went there or wish that you had stayed home? Has anything happened to you, or are you sometimes ill? Write everything. Don't be surprised, my Ivan, that we want to know all of this. You know very well the reason. It is love. While you were with us we were watching over you and now for me it is too long since you left. I haven't seen you for 20 months. I always think of you. I have to stop writing about this because my heart does not allow me to continue.

"Today is your birthday. I can picture you how I saw you 18 years ago, in the midwife's hands. All the events of your childhood your mother knows well — suffering, worrying, and enduring in silence.

"I am sad because when I was young I lost my mother who would remember my birthday. A hundred times I say, 'God, give your peace to my long-departed mother.' In my heart, I feel like this happened last year and I wish you, my dear son, long years of life in fear of the Lord. Give respect to people. Be happy and content."
