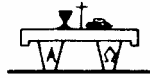

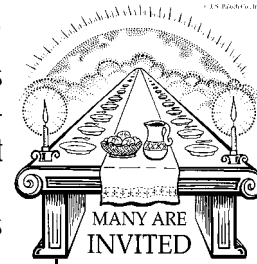

WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel parable speaks of three kinds of guests. There are the absentee guests who initially accepted the invitation, but when the time came to honor the invitation they drew back. There are the guests without wedding garments who attend the feast but do not take the trouble to prepare adequately for it, as the occasion deserves. And then there are the

guests with wedding garments who make the necessary preparation to present themselves fit for the banquet of the King.

Some of the absentee guests were not engaged in sinful activity. One went to his farm, another to his business — gainful and noble employments. Sometimes what keep us away from the joy of the kingdom is not sin but preoccupa-



tion with the necessities of life.

To be serious about a career is a good thing, but when preoccupation with it keeps a person away from attending the banquet of the Lord's Supper, then it becomes an obstacle that hinders the person from living in the joy of the Lord.

"Life is always a good. ...The life which God gives man is quite different from the life of all other living creatures, inasmuch as man ... is a manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory. ... An experiment in silence

Dear Friends,

Can staying silent lead
you to God?

I got an interesting mail from a friend of mine from Ireland. In that e-mail was a link to 12-part series called "*The Big Silence.*"

The series begins with Abbot Christopher Jamison, a Benedictine monk at Worth Abbey in West Sussex, England, who believes he can teach five ordinary people the value of silent meditation, so that they would make it part of their everyday lives

The BBC followed their journey, 8 days of total silence with the Benedictine monks. Fr. Jamison claims that silence is "the window to the soul."

"*The Big Silence*" – produced by Tiger Aspect and broadcast on BBC 2 – was an opportunity for five people, from very different backgrounds, to step back from their hectic lives and experience silence. By sharing with the Benedictine community in Worth Abbey and then spending eight days at a Jesuit retreat center in North Wales, they took part in a moving spiritual journey and shared their stories, their challenges and their frustrations with us.

The final stage was to try to carry something of what they had experienced in their own silence back into their busy lives. Most of them are non-believers, atheists or fallen-away Christians/Catholics. It is interesting to see what happened. Where do we meet the Lord? How?
