WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

A priest in New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina saw a child with one shoe. He asked where she had lost the other. The girl replied, "I didn't. I found this one."

God tells us through today's Gospel about wages: "Don't cut me down to your size. You can fashion God to *your* image, but I am real and an original." Two thirds of Jesus' parables concern money. The laborers in the parable were the lowest class of Jewish workers. They lived in near poverty. If they were unemployed for a day, their family went to bed hungry. Their situation was known to be so bad that when they were hired for a

day's work, the Bible commanded they be paid before sundown. The parable's hero is not the laborer but the vineyard owner. He represents God's love for us. What is God up to? There is an indication in today's Isaiah reading: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways."

Most of them police officers, superintendants present and past, the FBI chief, Homeland Security people, etc. — a very interesting crowd. But they gathered because of a priest, their friend, Fr. Tom Nagle, who was the Chicago Police Chaplain for almost 40 years. It was a powerful tribute, an inspiring evening, with many tears and much laughter. Fr. Tom is an interesting priest who spent his priestly ministry serving police officers, being with them in difficult times, presiding over their funerals, consoling family members, explaining the Gospel to them, teaching them wisdom and guiding them for many years. His life is probably well summed up by the words printed on the small cards placed on the tables: "Aside from finding Cod nothing in life is

"Aside from finding God, nothing in life is more important than falling in love. It will decide what gets you out of bed in the morning,

how you will spend your days and nights, how much you can endure and suffer and enjoy.

Fall in love, honor that love, stay in love, for that will shape your soul and your life. Love will decide everything, and that is good, for God is love."

What a beautiful way to spend our lives.

WISDOM'S CORNER Minimal...

Today's minimum wage is minimal. In 2004, over 50% of U.S. income went to the top 20% of our households. In 2002 and 2003, a woman with a \$7 million home paid only \$771 in federal taxes. In 2004, Americans spent \$34 billion on their pets. One woman's will left \$12 million to her dog. Result? Christ was deeply saddened. There are 2,000 verses on the poor in the Bible. Do you sense that God is trying to tell us something? Want to help the poor? You could lobby to have the minimum wage raised to a family-living level because 40% of U.S. minimum wage workers are the bread winners in their families. Many are single mothers. Don't delay. Every 43 seconds a child is born into poverty in the U.S. Every 53 minutes a child dies from the effects of poverty.

Since the U.S. government subsidizes our banks, airlines, railroads, and stock exchanges, why should it not better help the working poor?
