This individual responsibility in a Christian society includes, as today's readings remind us, our responsibility for each other.

When we think about, perhaps among the two most painful obligations of watchful love are fraternal correction and generosity in forgiving injuries.

"We should love *people* and use *things*, not the other way around!"

Can we go it alone? What can we do alone? It is not good to be alone. To be "left alone" is even worse. To live alone is difficult. To be excluded from others is a catastrophe. Praying alone can lead us to selfishness.

In today's Gospel, Christ tells us how important it is for two, three, or four to gather together to pray... He is present there. From the beginning, community was important to Christ — he built it, he called it the Church, and in it he left his mission of saving.

Therefore, it is not wise to think that we can be alone in our spirituality, that we can exclusively pray alone at home, and that we do not need to go to church because we are enough by ourselves. Those who mumble their prayers alone, oftentimes to themselves, can remain closed in their own world which has no exit nor does it see the light of day.

Why would we choose the path of being alone when we are given the community by Christ? Why choose the path opposite of Christ which leads us nowhere? Have we realized the importance of the Eucharist? Christ's presence? An encounter with him and others? What we can do together during the Holy Mass we cannot do alone. No, we truly cannot do it alone. Let's be aware of this wonderful gift of the community of faith.
