Engaged participation in the Holy Week liturgies will deepen our relationship with God, increase our faith and understanding, and strengthen our lives as disciples of Jesus. Today's Mass



combines contrasting moments of glory and suffering – the welcome of Jesus into Jerusalem with plenty of palm and the passion

drama of his suffering, culminating in his crucifixion.

It is a good time for the sacrament of reconciliation.

It is time to fully enter into Holy Week.



Our Parish History / Through Our Stories

A strong laborer grew old

My Didi on my mother's side, Duje Bilić, lived in our home at 3021 S. Parnell until he died in 1952 at age 85. A big-boned hulk of a man, he was like a gnarled leafless tree in my memory. My mother said that he was a laborer all of his life who worked on the construction of the original Chicago Stadium and the Morrison Hotel (now the State of Illinois Building site), among other structures. She said that he visited a doctor only once, after breaking an arm, and never had a hospital stay. I remember helping him around, not the Samson of his youth, but the aged man on unsure legs. He shared wine with his friends when my parents were at work - maybe too much at times - wine that he helped make with my father, to the consternation of my mother! But he was religious all of his hard-lived life.

One Christmas Eve, it was after an Evening or Midnight Service, and he was missing from home. After searching the neighborhood, my folks found him overlooked in the dark, sitting in the back of St. Jerome's. Many churches

remained open all night then. An ice storm had begun outside during the ceremonies. "Pa," "we didn't know where you she said. were." (We went to Masses both at St. Anthony Church on our side of the tracks and to Saint Jerome's.) "Why are you still here?" He wasn't senile, and it was not unusual, though a bit difficult, for him to go out on his own. She said that he looked up at her with sad, sorry eyes and said that he wasn't able to go home on his own, and they took him back home. Such were the lives of some of our forefathers. And the picture of the Sacred Heart that was over his bed with the Holy Palms behind it that were replaced each year is prominently displayed in our kitchen just as he is prominently on recall in my heart. — John Aranza

Midnight Mass

To my unique and only Parish:

As a child growing up, my family and I lived at 25th and Wentworth Ave. We always attended Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve and had to leave our house at 10 o'clock to be sure to have a seat because the church was always overcrowded. After I was married I kept up the tradition. At that time the Mass was said in Croatian — the sermon, music...— and lasted for about two hours. My husband, being Italian, did not understand one word but he knew how much the tradition meant to me. Out of love for me he always came. To this day I have attended the Mass for sixty years straight. —K.S.
